

What type of battery does a watch use?

Most watches use single use silver oxide batteries. Some watches use larger button cells. Rechargeable watch batteries are used in solar power and kinetic powered watches such as the Citizen Eco-Drive, Casio Solar Powered watches or Seiko Kinetic watches. Can You DIY a watch battery?

If you decide to DIY the project, then remember that the new watch battery should follow the watch manufacturer's recommendations. However, you can replace alkaline batteries with silver-oxide watch batteries if your watch is compatible with both. Do all watches use the same battery?

Since all watches use a button cell battery (also known as coin cell batteries), it is easy to assume that one size fits all and all watches take the same battery. However, this is not the case and in fact, there are many different types of watch batteries.
